GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

HORSES ENTERING THE GROUNDS FOR THE WSHJA HORSE SHOWS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY DOCUMENTATION OF EQUINE INFLUENZA VIRUS(EIV) AND EQUINE HERPESVIRUS(EHV) VACCINATIONS WITHIN SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO ENTERING THE SHOW GROUNDS.

CLOSING OF ENTRIES: Entries close Friday, Sept 1, 2023.

ENTRY PROCEDURES: Exhibitors may pay either by check or credit card. One check per owner. Exhibitors may also enter online with credit card at www.showgroundslive.com

- 1) Exhibitors may elect to pre-pay all show fees before the closing date of entries.
- 2) Exhibitors may pay the total of:
 - 1.) A deposit fee of \$50 per horse plus
 - 2.) All stall and tack room fees.
- 3) If the entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries AND are properly filled out, the \$50 entry deposit will be credited to the entries due. LATE AND / OR IMPROPER ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE.

TO BE COMPLETE ENTRY FORMS MUST INCLUDE:

- 1.) HORSE'S NAME AND COMPLETE DESCRIPTIONS
- 2.) ALL CLASSES OR SECTIONS ENTERED
- 3.) ALL MANDATORY SIGNATURES
- 4.) ORGANIZATION MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS
- 4) Trainers and owners may leave a signed, open check or credit card authorization for charges during show. All show accounts are to be closed by 5:00 p.m. Sunday.
- 5) ALL ENTRIES WHICH ARE LATE WILL BE ASSESSED A \$50 LATE FEE. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6) Exhibitors will receive their prize money within three weeks after the Horse Show.

CREDIT CARDS: Exhibitors wishing to pay by credit card will be charged a 4% convenience fee. Charges to credit cards come through on statements from the Washington State Hunter Jumper Association (WSHJA).

USHJA HORSE REGISTRATIONS: All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes (except those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-11) must be properly identified and must obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. A registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions.

CREDENTIALS: Exhibitors must have the following credentials:

- 1) USEF / USHJA membership card
- 2) USEF / USHJA amateur certification
- 3) USEF / USHJA Large, Small, Junior Hunter & Pony measurement card
- 4) USEF / USHJA horse recording
- 5) EC membership Card

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS: Entries must be paid by draft payable in US Funds or check on Canadian US Dollar account. Canadian checks with US Funds written on the face of the check will not be accepted.

POST ENTRIES & SCRATCHES: Post entries accepted the day of the class will be charged \$10/class. Refunds for scratched classes only provided if show office is notified the day before the class.

HUNTER / EQ /JUMPER NOMINATING FEE: Horses or ponies entered in any hunter or equitation classes at this show must pay a \$50 Hunter / EQ/Jumper Nomination Fee. This fee allows exhibitors to add / scratch classes up to 4:00 p.m. the day before.

SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vets certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. Added/scratched classes will be treated under Post Entries & Scratches. There will be a \$50 office charge.

CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES AND REFUNDS: Entries cancelled after the closing date shall forfeit the entry fee, except in

the case of disability of a horse, when entries shall be refunded on presentation to the Show Secretary, a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian PRIOR to the first class in which the horse is entered.

- 1) No refunds of entry fees shall be made after the first class in which the horse is entered unless a certificate of disability is presented to the horse show office.
- 2) There will be a \$50 office charge.
- 3) No refund of stall fees unless requested directly to the show secretary before September 1, 2023.
- 4) Refunds will be mailed within three weeks after the Horse Show.

RETURNED CHECKS/CREDIT CARDS: There will be a penalty of \$50 per charge returned by the bank for any reason. No checks/credit cards will be processed through the bank a second time. To retain entries, the fees and penalty must be paid by 4:00 p.m. the day before the Horse Show starts. In the event a check / credit card is returned after the completion of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913. No personal checks will be cashed at the Show. Please plan accordingly.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: Opportunity classes are exempt from the USEF Membership, USHJA Membership, Non-member Fee, USHJA Support Fee and US EQUESTRIAN Fee.

USEF FEE: For every horse participating in any competition recognized by the USEF, a \$23 USEF fee will be collected (\$15 shall be a Drugs & Medication fee to provide for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1, .2 and .3).

USHJA SUPPORT FEE: Every horse and pony entered in the Northwest Autumn Classic will be assessed a \$7 USHJA Support Fee.

SHOW PASS FEE: Effective 12-1-2022 any rider, handler, driver, or owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (December 1-November 30). USEF Show Pass will be available for purchase by exhibitors on-line only. Competitions should not accept payment for show pass fees and therefore this fee should not appear on the entry blank. Individuals, including parents who are signing as trainer on behalf of a minor, who are participating as a trainer or coach are not eligible for a Show Pass and must obtain a Senior Competing membership to participate in a USEF-licensed competition.

MEASUREMENTS: All Small, Junior, and Pony Hunters must possess and present a current measurement card to the show secretary before numbers may be picked up. Vet is scheduled at 2:00pm Thursday of the show for measurements.

MANAGEMENT: Management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes. Equitation classes not filling may be combined with the next age group. Notice will be given to exhibitors affected. Management reserves the right to start the first class of any session 30 minutes earlier than the scheduled time if entries warrant. Management reserves the right to make changes of arenas, judges, or class orders to facilitate time schedule and conditions.

COMBINED CLASSES & SECTIONS: Any class or section that does not have at least three entries will be combined. Junior, Amateur Owner, Children's and Adult Amateur Sections will be combined with fewer than four entries.

RIBBONS and PRIZE MONEY: Trophy and ribbons will be awarded to eight places in all Hunter, Equitation and Junior classes. Hunter and Hunter Classic prize money will be divided as follows: 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. USHJA National Hunter Derby prize money will be divided as follows: 30%, 22%,13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE: Show office hours:

Day Preceding Show: 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Days of Horse Show: 7:00 a.m. to 1/2 hour after end of show.

STABLING: Permanent box stalls with doors on matted pavement flooring provided. Shavings shall be provided. STALLS WILL NOT be available until 3PM FOR SETUP AND 4PM FOR HORSES. Stalls must be vacated no later than noon Monday, September 18. Fee for box is \$300 per stall fee for the week. Weekend stalls available for \$200. Please indicate arrival and departure date and who you are to be stabled with on the entry blank. Exhibitors do their own stall cleaning. No stall refunds will be given unless requested to the show secretary prior to September 1. Refunds after those dates will only be made if the stall is reissued to another entry.

EXHIBITORS WISHING TO BE STABLED WITH A SPECIFÍC STABLE MUST HAVE THEIR ENTRIES IN BY September 1, 2023.

HAUL-IN: There will be a \$50 per horse haul-in fee.

SHARPS CONTAINERS: Sharps containers will be placed at the end of each barn aisle. Competition Management may fine any individual up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

SHAVINGS & MANURE DISPOSAL FEE: There will be an \$115 per horse shavings & manure disposal fee. STALLS AND TACK STALLS must be fully clear of all garbage (twine, bottles, cans, etc) at end of show or be charged a \$200 fee for staff to pick up.

SCHOOLING AND EXERCISE: Schooling areas will be available for use before, during, and after the show. Schooling in the performance rings will be allowed on Tuesday over a posted course in the:

Park Slope Ring from 9:00am to 4:00pm

Absolute Horse Outdoor from 9:00am to 5:00pm.

All schooling will be charged a \$40 fee. Hard hats must be worn while schooling.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

HELMETS: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper, or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials), SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials), SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. (GR801)

TRAILER OR CAMPER HOOK-UPS: Trailer and camper hook-ups are available at a cost of \$250/week for power/water and \$300/week for power/water/septic. A card will be issued at the horse show office and must be displayed in a window facing the parking area. Hook-ups will be patrolled and enforced. There will be a charge of \$125/week for trailers and campers that park overnight but do not use hook-ups.

ARENAS & FOOTING: Park Slope Indoor is 120' x 248' and is GGT footing on dirt base. Absolute Horse Outdoor is 128' x 255'. The indoor schooling arena is 100 x 200. The footing is sand on a sand base.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION: Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 
Driving Directions to Evergreen Equestrian Park at the Evergreen State Fairgrounds

From the North: Southbound on I-5, take exit 194 to Hwy 2. Continue East for approximately 14 miles. The Evergreen Equestrian Park is located on the left side, North of US Hwy 2, just prior to entering Monroe. Take left on 179th and watch for parking signs.

From the South Via I-5: Northbound on I-5, take Exit to Hwy 2. Continue East for approximately 14 miles. The Evergreen Equestrian Park is located on the left side, North of US Hwy 2, just prior to entering Monroe. Take left on 179th and watch for parking signs.

From the South Via I-405: Drive Northbound on I-405, take Exit 123 (Woodinville) which connects to SR 522. Travel East on SR 522 until it ends at stoplight. Take second right on 179th, and watch for parking signs.

From Hwy 2: The Evergreen Equestrian Park is 50 miles West of Stevens Pass. Follow US Hwy 2 Westbound, past the Fred Meyer shopping center in Monroe. Continue under the 522 overpass, and take right on 179th. Watch for parking signs.

WSHJA MEDAL SPECIFICATIONS

WSHJA Good Seat and Hands 3'6" Medal

The WSHJA Good Seat and Hands Medal 3'6" is open to junior and amateur riders and can be held over a hunter or jumper type course with fences 3'6" in height. Qualifying classes will include three USEF Equitation Tests 1-17, and/or there may be further testing at the judge's discretion.

The WSHJA Good Seat and Hands Medal Finals 3'6" will consist of a course including *FOUR* USEF Equitation tests 1-17. Up to four riders may be called back for further testing, according to the judge's discretion.

Johnny Johnson Equitation Challenge

The Johnny Johnson Equitation Challenge is open to children, juniors, amateur, and professional riders and will be held over a hunter equitation course with fences 3' in height. The course must include one combination and two changes of direction after the first obstacle. Testing is optional and may include USEF Equitation tests 1-17, excluding 14. To fill a class, three competitors must complete the course.

Points for Johnny Johnson Equitation Challenge classes will accumulate over the show season. Points for the last Johnny Johnson Equitation Challenge class to be 2x regular equitation points. The last class is to be held at the Northwest Autumn Classic. The rider who earns the greatest number of points will be awarded a grand prize.

The Northwest Foundation Medal Class, 14 and under

The Northwest Foundation Medal, 14 and under is open to junior riders 14 years of age and under (per USEF horse show age requirements). To be judged over a hunter type course of fences 3'o" in height. Combinations are permitted. Liverpools are not allowed. A work off is required of at least 4 (if available) which may include USEF Equitation Tests 1 -17. Only one rider per horse. Conventional hunter tack and equipment is recommended. Unconventional tack and equipment is penalized at the judge's discretion. Three (3) contestants must complete the course in order for points to count.

Four (4) Points or more qualify a rider for the Northwest Foundation Final. Riders may continue to ride in the qualifying classes regardless of how many points he/she accumulates. Any winner of the Final is ineligible to compete in future Northwest Foundation Medal Classes. The Final will be held at the Northwest Autumn Classic Competition.

Northwest Foundation Medal Final, 14 and under

Open to riders who have qualified by winning a Northwest Foundation Medal Class with 3 or more riders completing the course or by accumulating four(4) points since the previous Northwest Foundation Medal Final. Riders must be 14 years of age or under (per USEF horse show age requirements). The Northwest Foundation Final will be judged over a hunter type course, with a minimum of eight (8) fences 3'o" in height. Combinations are permitted. Liverpools are not allowed. A work off is required of at least 4 (if available) and may include USEF Equitation Tests 1 -17. Only one rider per horse. Conventional hunter tack and equipment is recommended. Unconventional tack and equipment are penalized at judge's discretion.

The winning rider will receive a special award and cooler. The winning trainer will also receive a special award. In addition, ribbons will be awarded to the top 8 finalists.

<u>2023 USHJA ZONE 9</u> EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP SPECIFICATIONS

The USHJA Zone 9 Equitation Championship is open to junior members residing in Zone 9 who have placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in a state equitation medal or any national equitation class throughout the qualifying period. The course is a medal-type course consisting of a minimum of 10 fences with at least one combination and two changes of direction. The top 12 riders from the jumping phase (3'0", 3'3", and 3'6" combined) will return for a flat phase.

I. ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

- A. The Zone 9 Equitation Championship is open to junior members of the USHJA who reside in Zone 9.
- B. An eligible rider must be a current Active USEF and USHJA member in good standing (seeEQ103). The burden of proof of eligibility to compete will rest with and be the sole responsibility of the rider, and not of the USHJA. USHJA staff is not available to determine each rider's eligibility.
- C. The 3'0" section is limited to riders who have not competed three (3) or more times in any class or division at 3'3" or higher.
- D. The 3'3" section is limited to riders who have not competed three (3) or more times in any class or division at 3'6" or higher.
- E. Junior riders may qualify by placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in any of the Zone 9 state equitation medals or in any national equitation class in any state or zone between August 21st, 2022 and September 3rd, 2023. Below are the classes to count for qualifying:

- Northwest Foundation Medal 14 & under
- WSHJA 3' Good Seat and Hands
- WSHJA 3'6" Good Seat and Hands
- Johnny Johnson Equitation Challenge
- OHJA 3' Children's Medal
- OHJA 3'3" Junior Medal
- OHJA 3'6" Junior Medal

National Equitation Classes

- THIS Medal
- ASPCA Maclay
- WIHS Medal (Hunter and Jumper phases)
- USEF Hunt Seat Medal
- USHJA Hunter Seat Medal
- USHJA Jumping Seat Medal
- NHS Hamel

II. COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- A. The class will be divided into three (3) height sections: 3', 3'3", and 3'6". However, the three (3) height sections will be judged as one (1) class.
- B. The first round course shall consist of at least ten (10) fences with at least one (1) combination and two (2) changes of direction.
- C. The first round will start with the 3' section, followed by the 3'3" section and ending with the 3'6" section.
- D. If a ride off is conducted the 3'6" riders will jump first, followed by the 3'3" riders, and ending with the 3' riders.

III. SCORING

- A. The class must be scored numerically.
- B. The top 12 competitors will return for a flat phase.
- C. A minimum of the top four (4) riders will return after the flat phase for further testing.

IV. AWARDS

- A. An engraved picture frame will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion.
- B. Bridle ribbons and rider sashes will be presented to the Champion, Reserve Champion, and third place finishers.
- C. Bridle ribbons will be presented to riders placing 4th through 8th.
- D. Saddle pads will be given to all participants.

The USHJA Zone 9 Equitation Championship and the related format and specifications are the sole properties of the USHJA and may only be held, conducted or used upon the terms and conditions specified by the USHJA. USHJA reserves the right to change language in documents related to the conduct of the Zone 9 Equitation Championship as necessary for the purposes of consistency and clarity. Any deviations from the class specifications for the Zone 9 Equitation Championship are not permitted without the express written permission from USHJA prior to the printing of the prize list.
